Judith “Judy” Perlstein, 87, of Ft. Myers, FL passed away unexpectedly Friday, September 6, 2019 in Ft. Myers, FL. Judy was born in New York City, NY on March 20, 1932 to Milton and Beatrice Goldstein, now deceased. She graduated from Smith College in 1953 and that same week married the love of her life, Bob.
