Robert Stevens, age 95, passed away Wednesday, April 3rd, 2019, in Ft. Myers, FL. He was born in Sullivan, Missouri on November 23, 1923. His Father was Roy K. Stevens and his Mother was Hazel Shaw Stevens. Robert married Ruth Schmidt on October 10th 1948 and were parents of four children, Charles Robert Stevens, Denise Rose Stevens Estes, Marla Ruth Stevens, and Roy Kevin Stevens. Ruth went home to be with the Lord on May 18, 1965. Robert met and married Vernalea Housewright Tyrie on July 7th, 1975. Vernalea Stevens had three children from a previous marriage, Jeffrey Alan Tyrie, Randall Jay Tyrie and Julie Anne Tyrie Raymond (Scott).
