Richard Louis Houser of Fort Myers, Florida passed away Thursday, May 4, 2017 in Hope Hospice. He was 86. Dick was born October 28, 1930 in Montpelier, Ohio. He was the son of the late Louis and Wilma Houser. Dick maintained his strong ties to Montpelier, Ohio as a 1949 graduate of Montpelier High School. After graduation he began a 36 year career (1950 – 1986) with Mohawk Tools retiring as a District Sales Representative. After retirement, in 1987, he moved from Robbinsville, New Jersey to Fort Myers, Florida. He was also a proud veteran of the United States Army. Richard, nicknamed “Trouble” because of his wild sense of humor, was blessed with many good friends throughout his life. His love of sports, especially golf and bowling, old westerns and his dog, Bella, were things he enjoyed the most.
