Terry Lee Mather, age 73, of Lehigh Acres, FL passed away unexpectedly on January 13, 2021 as a result of complications following a stroke. He was born in Madison, WI, the son of Richard and Elaine (Gerling) Mather. He married the love of his life, Mary Lou Campbell, in March of 1968. The 53 year marriage blessed them with two daughters.

Terry served during Vietnam in the Army's 25th Infantry Division. He was awarded many medals including two Bronze Stars, two Purple Hearts, and the Army Commendation Medal of Valor. After Vietnam, he began working in the housing and truss industry. His work took him from being a draftsman to plant manager and across seven states.

He was a family man, a loving and caring husband, father, and papa. He also had a great love for his dogs, Jethro and Elly Mae.
