Terry and Beverly I am so sorry for your loss. Your mom and my Aunt Claudia was a very special lady!! I have so many memories of her (and Uncle Bob) even though we lived 1250 miles away and didn't get a chance to see them all that often. I remember she was in town for Grandma Anna's funeral in Dec 1975 and she told me how they had put in a pool and invited us down to Ft. Myer's for Christmas the next year at the old house in town. I vividly remember arriving after dark, sprinting from the car, right past both of them, straight to the backyard to check out the pool only to find nothing but backyard! I was beyond perplexed and went back inside to inquire only to be told that they had filled in the pool! Who does that? However the next morning I was able to walk out back and pick my breakfast off a tree, I'd never done that before. On that trip, they took us to the Thomas Edison winter home, to an Indian reservation in the Everglades, Uncle Bob took us fishing on the river (I caught a Sheepshead that day and almost drowned when the bank gave way, but Uncle Bob and 2 fisherman came sprinting over to pull me out) and they also took us to Hot Dog King for lunch. Uncle Bob's answer to anything I said to him was "How bout that", I'll never forget that. They were in South Bend, maybe for the last time and came to visit Becky and I shortly after we were married in 1995. They drove out to Sanibel Island to visit us and our new baby boy Benjamin for lunch by the pool at West Wind Inn in October 2000 and had us over for dinner one evening that trip. When we were back in Sanibel in October 2004 right after Hurricane Charley, the 4 of you had us over to the new house (Bruce's cabin in the country as I'll always remember it). As we were standing out back listening to Uncle Bob tell us about the storm damage and flooding on the property, I soon realized that I was standing on a fire ant hill and soon my feet and legs were covered with biting ants. That was some pain! But Aunt Claudia knew exactly what to do and ran inside and came back out with an aerosol can of hairspray and sprayed it all over the bites and the pain immediately subsided. A few years later in the spring of 2008 when Ben was 8 and Bailey 7, y'all took us to dinner at the Country Club on the same road as the Edison/Ford museum with the towering Royal Palms. She talked about how she had always wished she had a globe for her house. We we got home I happened to see one in a magazine and had it shipped to her. I still have her thank you voicemail on my phone, on 7/30/2008. Then there was the trips to Orlando. I can't thank you enough for the two times you both drove them up to Orlando while we were at Disney to visit for lunch. In 2011 we had just gotten lunch by the pool and it started to pour and we spent the next 3 hours inside the dining hall just talking, even the kids. In 2013 you said they weren't up for the trip but in August 2015 I BEGGED you to bring them up again and y'all came again for lunch. I still have a photo from that day in my office. Thanks again so much. Then on spring break 2019, we came over from Captiva to have dinner with you both and Terry took us to see her beforehand in her diminished state, but I am forever grateful that we got to see her one last time. Not sure that she knew us but she had the same ol' laugh. I know this post was more than memories of just Aunt Claudia, but my memories of her include all of you. I'm sure more will come to mind when I submit. Sure praying that our plans aren't cancelled again this year and we get to see you both in November. Love you two.
