Lucille Visciotti, beloved wife, mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother, passed away peacefully on June 28, 2025, leaving behind a legacy of love, faith, and devotion.

Born in Keene, New Hampshire, in 1937, Lucille was one of eleven children and spent her formative years on the family farm. Her early life was marked by resilience and adaptability, as her family moved frequently throughout upstate New York. Lucille moved with her family to St. Petersburg, Florida in 1954.

On December 16, 1962, Lucille married Luigi Visciotti, an Italian tailor whose skill and dedication matched her own steadfast spirit. Together, they built a beautiful life and welcomed three children: Amina, Gina, and Luigi Jr. The family eventually settled in Fort Myers, Florida, where Lucille and Luigi owned and operated Luigi's Tailoring on Cleveland Avenue — a cherished local business known for excellent tailoring and personal care where Lucille was a seamstress.

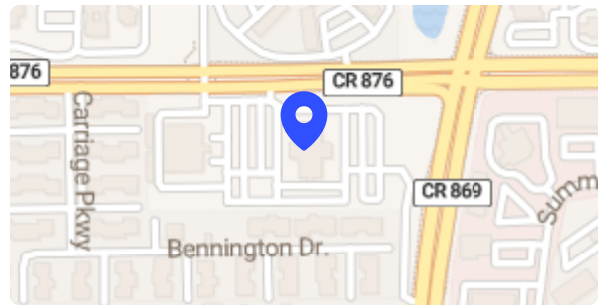
